White-fronted Swift

rarely seen, little known

Field Identification Marks:

- White lores & forehead
- White chin
- White post-ocular spot



White-fronted Swift Photos eBird mass ~40g

Hard to identify in flight: similar appearance to Chestnut-collared and Black Swifts



White-fronted Swift occurs in **Mexico**




ECOREGIONS OF MEXICO, dots are records

White-fronted Swift nest search


- Where?
- Tacámbaro, Mexico
- When?
- Rainy Season
- (begins June)

Methods: search with telescope, careful scanning of waterfall cliff

White-fronted Swift

- Nest at Salto de Agua, Yoricostio, Michoacán, Mexico
- Waterfall (~15m height)
- Under forest canopy of tall pines and oaks
- Also nesting here 1 pair of White-naped Swifts, *Streptoprocne semicollaris*



White-naped Swift, Streptoprocne semicollaris


- Nesting at same waterfall
- Largest swift in New World
- 180g
- Feeding nestling
- White on nape (back of neck)





White-fronted Swift

- Nest location: Salto de Agua, Yoricostio, Michoacán, Mexico
- Nest concealed behind main flow of water
- 2.7 m above plunge pool



- Yoricostio
- Nest
- Wingtips visible








White-fronted Swift

- Nest at Salto de Agua, Yoricostio, Michoacán, Mexico
- 30 June 2022
- Neither nest nor bird was collected
- Diagnostic photo is sufficient documentation

Second nest discovered





Salto Santa Paula, Tacámbaro

- Nest location circled
- 1 m from main flow
- In dry area under a rock roof

Results White-fronted Swift nest

- Moss and mud, no saliva
- One nestling
- Nest at Salto de Agua, Yoricostio, Michoacan, Mexico
- 30 June 2022

Conclusions

- White-fronted Swifts nest at waterfalls, like other *Cypseloides*
- Nesting season begins in June with the beginning of Rainy Season, same as other tropical Cypseloides
- 1 nestling observed matches clutch size of 1 egg, known for other *Cypseloides*
